New BURGLARY HELPLINE

Northamptonshire Police have produced a pack giving advice on measures that can be taken to protect against burglary. Leaflets show how you can make your home more secure, deal with distraction burglars, mark property and choose a burglar alarm. The pack is free and can be obtained by calling 01327 303189. You will hear a recorded message and then have to leave your name, address (including postcode) and 'phone number. HELICOPTER LANDINGS AT SLAPTON

At a recent Parish Council meeting we received a request from Andrew Young, chairman of Slapton Parish Meeting, to support Slapton residents who have objected to the frequent helicopter landings there. The first step is to persuade the District Council, who are responsible for planning matters, that the use of the helicopter requires planning permission. The law is not clear on this point, but the District Council is more likely to take action if there is strong local feeling. Many Slapton residents have signed a petition to the District Council and our support has been requested. It is difficult to personally visit everyone in the village, but if you want to sign the petition, contact Keith Fenwick.

WAR MEMORIAL

Refurbishment of the War Memorial has now been carried out with the remaining funds from the Millennium appeal. The stonework has been cleaned, moss removed and all the loose pointing replaced. On the stonemason's advice, no attempt has been made to repair the raised lettering which has weathered badly. Instead, a brass plaque and will be added to record the names for posterity.

ROADWORKS

We were all inconvenienced by the closure of the road to Towcester last autumn. Subsequently many people have commented on the uneven quality of the new surface and the poor drainage. This has been taken up with Atkins, who manage road maintenance on behalf of the County Council. The good news is that remedial work will be undertaken, but the road will again have to be closed.

ST JOHN THE BAPTIST CHURCH, ABTHORPE

The village church is part of the Whittlewood Parishes, consisting of Silverstone, Abthorpe, Slapton, Whittlebury and Paulerspury. Services are held in Abthorpe church every week: Morning Prayer on the first and third Sundays of each month at 9.15am, and Holy Communion on the second and fourth Sundays at 11.00am. All are most welcome. Please check on the village notice board or in the church porch for details. The church is usually open every day during daylight hours. If locked, the key can be obtained from David Hughes, The Cottage, Church Lane.

Collections at all services during January are being donated to the Tsunami Appeal and anyone can leave a donation in the offertory box in church.

NEWS FROM THE NEW INN

MUMS AND TOTS

This is a friendly and informal group which meets once a month. Mums, Dads or other carers get together whilst their pre-schoolers play. It's a good way for new parents – either to the village or to parenting itself – to meet others with children of a similar age. SPEEDING THROUGH THE VILLAGE

There has been concern over many years about the speed of traffic through the village. Recently the Parish Council coordinated volunteers to be trained to take part in Community Speedwatch, a trial scheme using a speed gun to measure vehicle speed during specific one hour sessions over three two-week periods. The impact of the flourescent jackets was amazing and cars visibly slowed. Despite the Towcester road being closed the volunteers caught between 10% and 20% of the volume of cars per hour, ranging from 5 to 20 cars per session, exceeding the limit. This information was forward to the police to act on. The support of the volunteers who participated in the scheme was much appreciated.

FIELDFARES RETURN

Each new year Abthorpe welcomes back regular visitors - the Fieldfares who fly in from Scandinavia and to northern Russia spend time in our village. They have been spotted feeding on berries and fallen fruit. These members of the thrush family fly to England when temperatures plummet in their summer breeding grounds close to the Arctic and food supplies there become scarce. Watch out for these delightful birds with their mottled breasts, blue-grey head and rump plus chestnut back and wings.
